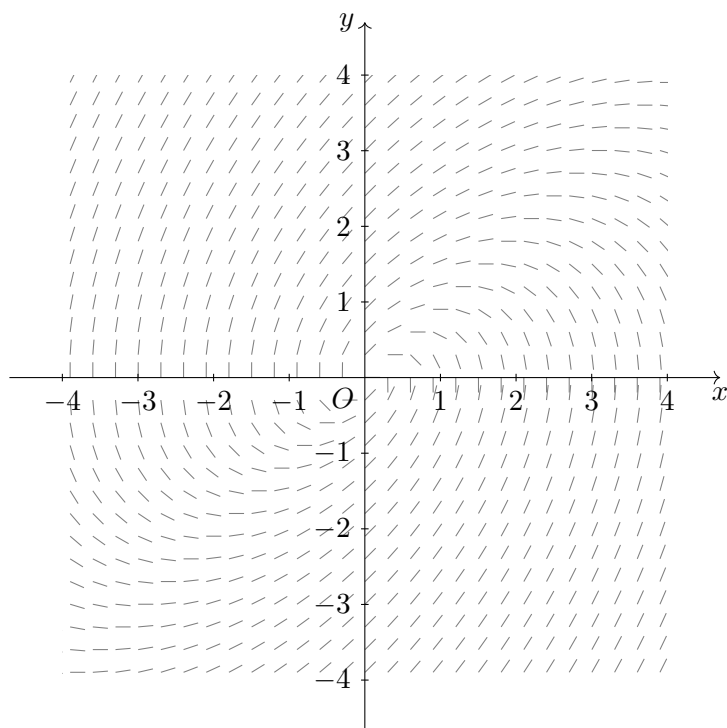
1. Which of the following is the solution to $\frac{x-2}{x} \leq 2$?
 - A. $x \in [-2, 0)$

2. When a polynomial $P(x)$ is divided by $x - 2$ the remainder is 4 and when it is divided by $x + 3$ the remainder is 9. What is the remainder when it is divided by $(x - 2)(x + 3)$?

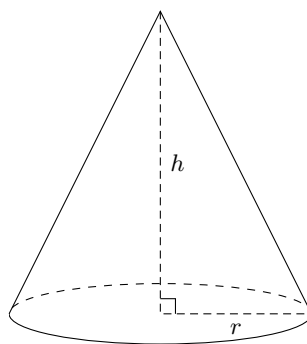

Your responses should include relevant mathematical reasoning and/or calculations.

Question 11 (15 marks) Start a new booklet

- (a) A bag contains red and black counters in the ratio 7 : 3. A counter is drawn, its colour recorded, and it is returned into the bag. This Bernoulli experiment is repeated 20 times. Let X be the random variable representing the number of red counters.
- (i) Find the expected value $E(X)$. 1
- (ii) Find the variance $\text{Var}(X)$. 1
- (iii) What is the probability that the number of red counters is the expected value? 1
- (b) (i) Express $\sin x + \sqrt{3}\cos x$ in the form $R\cos(x - \alpha)$, where $R > 0$ and $0 \leq \alpha \leq \frac{\pi}{2}$. 3
- (ii) Hence or otherwise solve $\sin x + \sqrt{3}\cos x = 1$ for $0 \leq x \leq 2\pi$. 2
- (c) Find the general solution to the differential equation $\frac{dy}{dx} = x(y + 1)$. 2
- (d) A committee of 5 is to be chosen from 5 men and 4 women. What is the probability that the committee contains three women? 2
- (e) Mineral ore is mined and stockpiled, forming a conical pile whose base diameter is equal to the height of the cone, i.e. $h = 2r$, as shown in the diagram below. 3

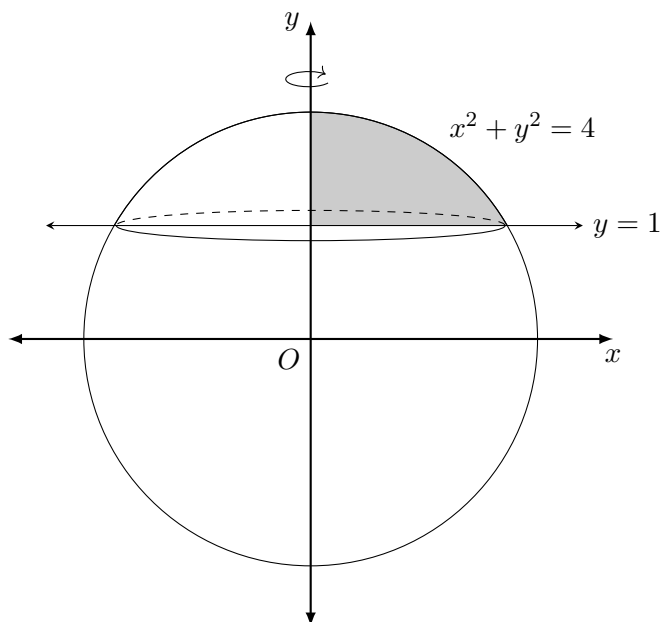


If the ore is poured onto the pile at a rate of 5 m^3 per minute, find the rate at which the height of the cone is increasing when it is 3 metres high? [Note: $V_{\text{cone}} = \frac{1}{3}\pi r^2 h$]

Question 12 (15 marks) Start a new booklet

- (a) Find the value of the constant term in the expansion of $(x+2)\left(2-\frac{3}{x}\right)^6$. **2**
- (b) Find the exact value of $\int_0^{\frac{\pi}{3}} \cos^2 x \, dx$. **3**
- (c) Use the substitution $u = x + 3$ to evaluate $\int_0^1 \frac{x+1}{\sqrt{x+3}} \, dx$. **3**
- (d) Given the function $f(x) = x^2 - 1$, sketch $y^2 = f(x)$. **2**
- (e) The percentage of male babies born is 51%. If a random sample of 250 babies is taken use the standard normal distribution tables provided to calculate the probability that there are more female babies in the sample. **3**
- (f) Find the volume of the spherical cap formed when the region bounded by $x^2 + y^2 = 4$, the y -axis and the line $y = 1$ is rotated around the y -axis. **2**

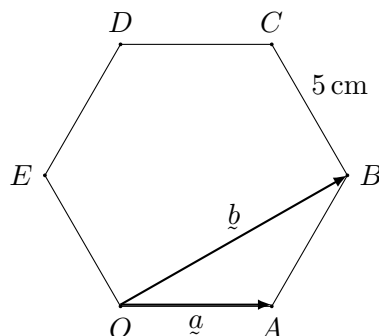
Question 13 (15 marks) Start a new booklet

(a) Find $f^{-1}(x)$ if $f(x) = \frac{x+1}{x-2}$, clearly indicating the domain and range of $f^{-1}(x)$. **3**

(b) Find the value of b for which **3**

$$\int_0^1 \frac{dx}{\sqrt{4-3x^2}} = \int_0^b \frac{dx}{\sqrt{1-x^2}}.$$

(c) A regular hexagon $OABCDE$ is drawn below. The sides of the hexagon are 5 cm.
Let $\overrightarrow{OA}$ be $\underline{a}$ and $\overrightarrow{OB}$ be $\underline{b}$.



(i) Express $\overrightarrow{AB}$ in terms of $\underline{a}$ and $\underline{b}$. **1**

(ii) Given that $\angle OAB = 120^\circ$, show that $|\underline{b}| = 5\sqrt{3}$ cm. **2**

(iii) Hence or otherwise find the exact area of the hexagon. **2**

(d) The mass in kilograms M of a chemical produced per hour in a chemical reaction is modelled by the differential equation **4**

$$\frac{dM}{dt} = 6 - \frac{M}{20}.$$

Initially there are 20 kilograms of the chemical. Solve the differential equation to find the time taken, to the nearest minute, for another 20 kilograms to be produced.

Question 14 (15 marks) Start a new booklet

- (a) Prove by mathematical induction that for all integers $n \geq 1$,

3

$$\frac{1}{\sqrt{2} + \sqrt{1}} + \frac{1}{\sqrt{3} + \sqrt{2}} + \frac{1}{\sqrt{4} + \sqrt{3}} + \cdots + \frac{1}{\sqrt{n+1} + \sqrt{n}} = \sqrt{n+1} - 1.$$

- (b) Points A and B have position vectors $\vec{OA} = 3\vec{i} + \vec{j}$ and $\vec{OB} = 2\vec{j}$.

- (i) Find $\vec{AB}$ and hence find the projection of $\vec{AO}$ onto $\vec{AB}$.

- (ii) Let P be a point on $\vec{AB}$ such that $\vec{OP} \perp \vec{AB}$. Find $\vec{OP}$.

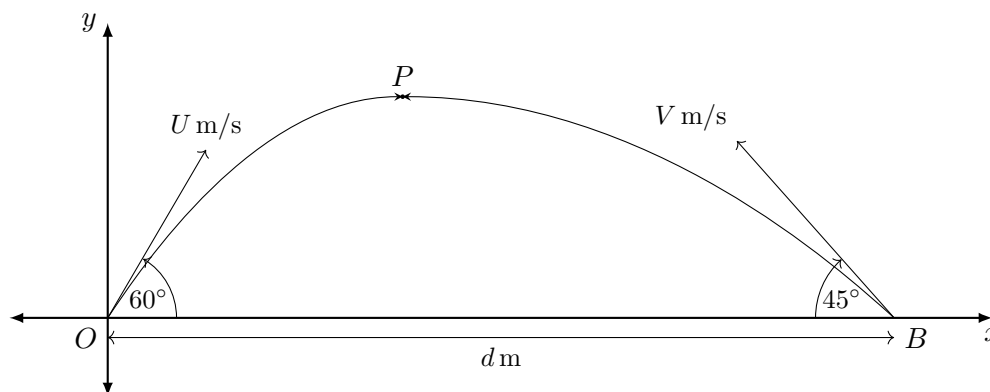
- (c) (i) Show that $\cos 3\theta = 4\cos^3 \theta - 3\cos \theta$.

2

- (ii) Let $x = \cos \theta$. Find three distinct roots of $8x^3 - 6x - 1 = 0$.

- (d) Two projectiles are fired at the same time to collide at a point P , when they are both at their maximum height. Projectile A is fired from the origin at a speed of U m/s and at an angle of 60° from the horizontal. Projectile B is fired from point B , d metres from O at a speed of V m/s and at an angle of 45° from the horizontal, as shown in the diagram below.



The displacement vector equations from O are as follows. You do NOT need to derive these.

$$\vec{r}_A(t) = \left(\frac{U}{2}t\right)\vec{i} + \left(\frac{U\sqrt{3}}{2}t - 5t^2\right)\vec{j}$$

$$\vec{r}_B(t) = \left(d - \frac{V}{\sqrt{2}}t\right)\vec{i} + \left(\frac{V}{\sqrt{2}}t - 5t^2\right)\vec{j}$$

- (i) Show that the projectile from O reaches its maximum height after $t = \frac{U\sqrt{3}}{20}$ seconds.

- (ii) Show that for the collision to occur, the speed of the projectile from B must be

$$V = \frac{U\sqrt{6}}{2}.$$

- (iii) Find the distance d between the two projectiles in terms of U .

Multiple Choice

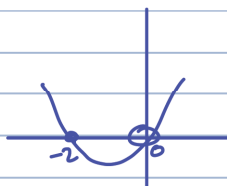
1. $\frac{x-2}{x} \leq 2 \quad x \neq 0$

$$x(x-2) \leq 2x^2 \quad x \neq 0$$

$$2x^2 - x^2 + 2x \geq 0 \quad x \neq 0$$

$$x^2 + 2x \geq 0 \quad x \neq 0$$

$$x(x+2) \geq 0 \quad x \neq 0$$



$$\therefore x \leq -2 \text{ or } x > 0 \quad \text{or } x \in (-\infty, -2] \cup (0, \infty)$$

(C)

2. $P(2) = 4$
 $P(-3) = 9$

$$P(x) = (x-2)(x+3)Q(x) + ax + b$$

$$\text{So } P(2) = 2a + b = 4 \quad (1)$$

$$P(-3) = -3a + b = 9 \quad (2)$$

$$\text{Solving (1) and (2) simultaneously} \Rightarrow \begin{aligned} a &= -1 \\ b &= 6 \end{aligned}$$

$$\therefore \text{remainder is } -x + 6$$

(C)

3. To be sure you have 9 of same colour, you could choose:

6 red and 8 green and 8 blue and 8 yellow = 30

The next ball must be blue or yellow which gives 31

(B)

4. $\sin \frac{\pi}{8} \cos \frac{\pi}{8} = \frac{1}{2} \sin \frac{\pi}{4}$

$$= \frac{1}{2} \cdot \frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$$

$$= \frac{\sqrt{2}}{4}$$

(D)

5. By inspection, when $x=0$ slope is defined

$\therefore$ not C or D

then $y=x$ slope is 1 $\therefore$ not B so... (A)

6. No. of arrangements without restriction is $8!$

No. of arrangements (boys together) is $6! 3!$

$$\therefore \text{Probability boys together is } \frac{6! 3!}{8!} = \frac{3}{28} \quad (\text{C})$$

7. As more samples $E(\hat{p}) \rightarrow p$

and $\text{Var}(\hat{p})$ decreases (B)

$$\begin{aligned} 8. \quad y' &= \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{1 + \left(\frac{x}{2}\right)^2} \\ &= \frac{1}{\frac{2(4 + x^2)}{4}} \\ &= \frac{2}{4 + x^2} \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{when } x = 1 \quad y' = \frac{2}{5} \quad (\text{B})$$

9. Domain of cartesian equation is range of $x = \cos^2 t$

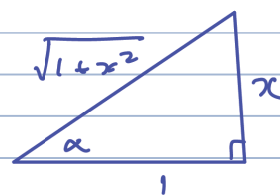
$$\therefore [0, 1] \quad (\text{A})$$

10. Let $\alpha = \tan^{-1} x$

$$\therefore \tan \alpha = x$$

$$\text{So } \sin(\tan^{-1} x) = \sin \alpha$$

$$= \frac{x}{\sqrt{1+x^2}} \quad (\text{B})$$



Question 11

(a) (i) $E(X) = np = 14$ ✓

(ii) $\text{Var}(X) = npq = 4.2$ ✓

(iii) $P(X=14) = {}^{20}C_{14} (0.7)^{14} (0.3)^6$ ✓
 $= 0.1916$

(3)

(b) (i) $R \cos x \cos \alpha + R \sin x \sin \alpha = \sin x + \sqrt{3} \cos x$ ✓

Equating coefficients : $R \cos \alpha = \sqrt{3}$ (1)

$R \sin \alpha = 1$ (2)

$\therefore R = 2$ ✓

$\tan \alpha = \frac{1}{\sqrt{3}}$ (1st Q since $\cos \alpha, \sin \alpha > 0$)

$\therefore \alpha = \frac{\pi}{6}$ ✓

So $\sin x + \sqrt{3} \cos x = 2 \cos(x - \frac{\pi}{6})$

(ii) $2 \cos(x - \frac{\pi}{6}) = 1$ $-\frac{\pi}{2} \leq x - \frac{\pi}{6} \leq \frac{\pi}{2}$

$\cos(x - \frac{\pi}{6}) = \frac{1}{2}$ ✓

$x - \frac{\pi}{6} = \frac{\pi}{3}, \frac{5\pi}{3}$

$\therefore x = \frac{\pi}{2}, \frac{11\pi}{6}$ ✓

(5)

$$(c) \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = x(y+1)$$

$$\frac{dy}{y+1} = x dx$$

$$\ln|y+1| = \frac{x^2}{2} + c$$

$$y+1 = A e^{x^2/2}, \quad A \in \mathbb{R}$$

$$y = A e^{x^2/2} - 1$$

(2)

$$(d) \quad P(3W, 2M) = \frac{{}^4C_3 \times {}^5C_2}{{}^9C_5}$$

$$= \frac{40}{126}$$

$$= \frac{20}{63}$$

(2)

$$(e) \quad \text{Need to find } \frac{dh}{dt}$$

$$V = \frac{1}{3} \pi r^2 h$$

$$r = \frac{h}{2}$$

$$\therefore V = \frac{1}{3} \pi \frac{h^3}{4}$$

$$\frac{dh}{dt} = \frac{dh}{dV} \times \frac{dV}{dt}$$

$$\frac{dV}{dh} = \frac{\pi h^2}{4} \quad \therefore \frac{dh}{dV} = \frac{4}{\pi h^2}$$

$$= \frac{4}{\pi h^2} \times 5$$

$$\text{And: } \frac{dV}{dt} = 5$$

$$= \frac{20}{\pi h^2}$$

$$\therefore \text{When } h=3 \quad \frac{dh}{dt} = \frac{20}{9\pi} \text{ m/min}$$

Question 12

$$\begin{aligned} \text{(a)} \quad (x+2)\left(2-\frac{3}{x}\right)^6 &= (x+2)\left(2^6 - {}^6C_1 2^5 \left(\frac{3}{x}\right)^1 + \dots\right) \checkmark \\ &= 2 \cdot 2^6 - {}^6C_1 2^5 3^1 \\ &= 2^7 - 6 \cdot 2^5 \cdot 3 \\ &= -448 \quad \checkmark \end{aligned}$$

(2)

$$\begin{aligned} \text{(b)} \quad \int_0^{\pi/3} \cos^2 x \, dx &= \int_0^{\pi/3} \frac{1}{2} + \frac{\cos 2x}{2} \, dx \quad \checkmark \\ &= \left[\frac{x}{2} + \frac{\sin 2x}{4} \right]_0^{\pi/3} \quad \checkmark \\ &= \frac{\pi}{6} + \frac{\sqrt{3}}{8} \quad \checkmark \end{aligned}$$

(3)

$$\begin{aligned} \text{(c)} \quad \int_0^1 \frac{x+1}{\sqrt{x+3}} \, dx & \quad \begin{array}{ll} u = x+3 & \therefore x+1 = u-2 \\ du = dx & \begin{array}{ll} x=0 & u=3 \\ x=1 & u=4 \end{array} \end{array} \end{aligned}$$

$$= \int_3^4 \frac{u-2}{\sqrt{u}} \, du \quad \checkmark$$

$$= \int_3^4 \left(u^{1/2} - 2u^{-1/2} \right) \, du \quad \checkmark$$

$$= \left[\frac{2u^{3/2}}{3} - 2 \cdot 2u^{1/2} \right]_3^4$$

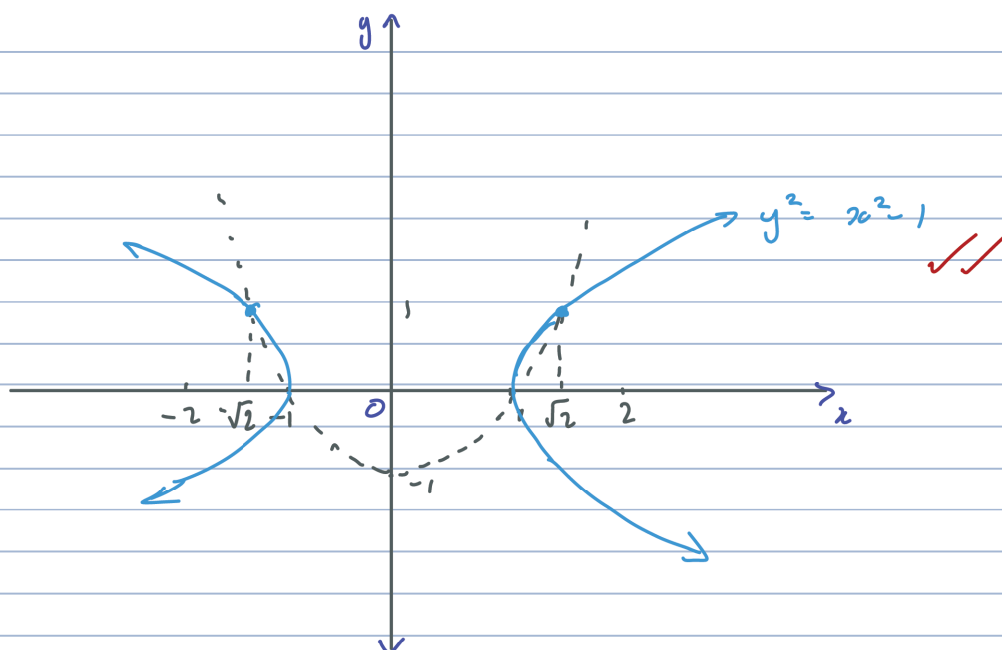
$$= \left(\frac{16}{3} - 8 \right) - \left(\frac{2}{3} \sqrt{27} - 4\sqrt{3} \right)$$

$$= -\frac{8}{3} + 2\sqrt{3}$$

$$= 2\sqrt{3} - \frac{8}{3} \quad \text{or} \quad \frac{6\sqrt{3} - 8}{3} \quad \checkmark$$

(3)

$$(e) \quad \hat{p} = 0.51$$

$$E(\hat{p}) = 0.51$$

$$\text{Var}(\hat{p}) = \frac{0.51 \times 0.49}{250}$$

$$\therefore \sigma(\hat{p}) = 0.0316 \dots$$

$$P(\hat{p} < 0.50) = P\left(z < \frac{0.50 - 0.51}{0.0316 \dots}\right)$$

$$= P(z < -0.31629 \dots)$$

$$= P(z > 0.31629 \dots)$$

$$= 1 - P(z < 0.32)$$

$$= 1 - 0.6255$$

$$= 0.3745$$

(e)

$$V = \pi \int_1^2 x^2 dy$$

$$= \pi \int_1^2 (4 - y^2) dy$$

$$= \pi \left[4y - \frac{y^3}{3} \right]_1^2$$

$$= \pi \left[8 - \frac{8}{3} - \left(4 - \frac{1}{3} \right) \right]$$

$$= \frac{5\pi}{3}$$

Question 13

(a) Let $y = \frac{x+1}{x-2}$ D: $x \in \mathbb{R}, x \neq 2$

$$y = \frac{x-2}{x-2} + \frac{3}{x-2}$$

$$= 1 + \frac{3}{x-2}$$

$\therefore$ R: $y \in \mathbb{R}, y \neq 1$

Interchange x and y

$$x = \frac{y+1}{y-2}$$

$$xy - 2x = y + 1$$

$$y(x-1) = 2x + 1$$

$$y = \frac{2x+1}{x-1}$$

$$\therefore f^{-1}(x) = \frac{2x+1}{x-1}$$

D: $x \in \mathbb{R}, x \neq 1$

R: $y \in \mathbb{R}, y \neq 2$

(b)

$$\int_0^1 \frac{dx}{\sqrt{4-3x^2}} = \frac{1}{\sqrt{3}} \int \frac{\sqrt{3}}{\sqrt{4-3x^2}} dx$$

$$= \frac{1}{\sqrt{3}} \left[\sin^{-1} \frac{\sqrt{3}x}{2} \right]_0^1$$

$$= \frac{1}{\sqrt{3}} \left(\sin^{-1} \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} - \sin^{-1} 0 \right)$$

$$= \frac{\pi}{3\sqrt{3}}$$

$$a = 2$$

$$f(x) = \sqrt{3}x$$

$$f'(x) = \sqrt{3}$$

$$\text{So } \int_0^b \frac{dx}{\sqrt{1-x^2}} = \frac{\pi}{3\sqrt{3}}$$

$$\left[\sin^{-1} x \right]_0^b = \frac{\pi}{3\sqrt{3}}$$

$$\therefore \sin^{-1} b = \frac{\pi}{3\sqrt{3}}$$

$$b = \sin \frac{\pi}{3\sqrt{3}}$$

$$\approx 0.568$$

$$(c) \quad (i) \quad \vec{AB} = \underline{b} - \underline{a} \quad \checkmark$$

$$(ii) \quad -\underline{a} \cdot (\underline{b} - \underline{a}) = |\underline{a}| |\underline{b} - \underline{a}| \cos 120^\circ$$

$$-\underline{a} \cdot \underline{b} + |\underline{a}|^2 = 25 \left(-\frac{1}{2}\right) \quad \checkmark$$

$$\begin{aligned} \therefore \underline{a} \cdot \underline{b} &= |\underline{a}|^2 + \frac{25}{2} \\ &= \frac{75}{2} \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{Also } \underline{a} \cdot \underline{b} = |\underline{a}| |\underline{b}| \cos 30^\circ$$

$$\therefore |\underline{b}| = \frac{\underline{a} \cdot \underline{b}}{5\sqrt{3}} \quad \checkmark$$

$$\begin{aligned} &= \frac{\frac{75}{2}}{5\sqrt{3}} \\ &= 5\sqrt{3} \end{aligned}$$

$$(iii) \quad \text{Area} = 2 \cdot \frac{1}{2} |\underline{a}| |\underline{b} - \underline{a}| \sin 120^\circ + |\underline{b}| |\underline{a}| \quad \checkmark$$

$$= 25 \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} + 5\sqrt{3} \cdot 5$$

$$= \frac{25\sqrt{3}}{2} + \frac{50\sqrt{3}}{2}$$

$$= \frac{75\sqrt{3}}{2} \text{ cm}^2 \quad \checkmark$$

(5)

$$(c) \quad \frac{dM}{dt} = \frac{120 - M}{20}$$

$$\frac{dM}{120 - M} = \frac{dt}{20}$$

$$-\ln(120 - M) = \frac{t}{20} + c \quad \checkmark$$

$$120 - M = A e^{-t/20} \quad A \in \mathbb{R}$$

$$\text{When } t = 0, M = 20$$

$$\therefore 100 = A$$

$$\text{So } 120 - M = 100 e^{-t/20}$$

$$M = 120 - 100 e^{-t/20} \quad \checkmark$$

Now find t for when $M = 40$

$$40 = 120 - 100 e^{-t/20}$$

$$0.8 = e^{-t/20}$$

$$\ln(0.8) = -\frac{t}{20} \quad \checkmark$$

$$t = -20 \ln\left(\frac{8}{10}\right)$$

$$= 20 \ln(1.25)$$

$$= 4.46287 \dots$$

$\therefore t$ is 4h 28 minutes
(nearest minute) $\checkmark$ (4)

Question 14

(a)

$$\begin{aligned} \text{For } n=1 \quad \text{LHS} &= \frac{1}{\sqrt{2} + \sqrt{1}} & \text{RHS} &= \sqrt{1+1} - 1 \\ &= \frac{\sqrt{2} - 1}{2 - 1} & &= \sqrt{2} - 1 \\ &= \sqrt{2} - 1 \end{aligned}$$

$$\therefore \text{LHS} = \text{RHS}$$

Assume the result is true for $n=k$

$$\frac{1}{\sqrt{2} + \sqrt{1}} + \frac{1}{\sqrt{3} + \sqrt{2}} + \dots + \frac{1}{\sqrt{k+1} + \sqrt{k}} = \sqrt{k+1} - 1 \quad *$$

We need to show that it is also true for $n=k+1$

$$\text{i.e. } \frac{1}{\sqrt{2} + \sqrt{1}} + \frac{1}{\sqrt{3} + \sqrt{2}} + \dots + \frac{1}{\sqrt{k+1} + \sqrt{k}} + \frac{1}{\sqrt{k+2} + \sqrt{k+1}} = \sqrt{k+2} - 1$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Now LHS} &= \sqrt{k+1} - 1 + \frac{1}{\sqrt{k+2} + \sqrt{k+1}} && \text{by } * \\ &= \sqrt{k+1} - 1 + \frac{\sqrt{k+2} - \sqrt{k+1}}{k+2 - (k+1)} \\ &= \sqrt{k+1} - 1 + \frac{\sqrt{k+2} - \sqrt{k+1}}{1} \\ &= \cancel{\sqrt{k+1}} - 1 + \sqrt{k+2} - \cancel{\sqrt{k+1}} \\ &= \sqrt{k+2} - 1 \\ &= \text{RHS} \quad \text{as required} \end{aligned}$$

Thus, by the principle of mathematical induction the result is true for all integers, $n \geq 1$

$$(b) \quad (i) \quad \vec{AB} = \vec{OB} - \vec{OA}$$

$$\vec{AO} = \begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ -1 \end{bmatrix} \quad \therefore \text{proj}_{\vec{AB}} \vec{AO} = \frac{\begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ -1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}}{10} \begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

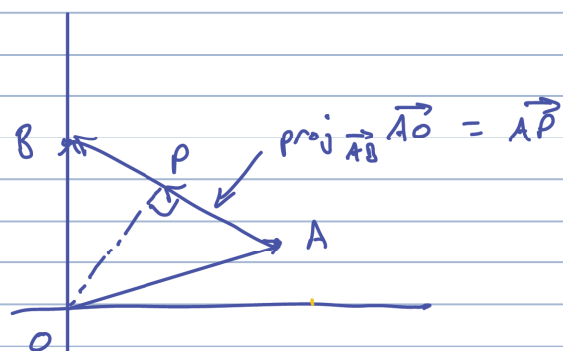
$$= \frac{4}{5} \begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$(ii) \quad \text{No} \quad \text{proj}_{\vec{AB}} \vec{AO} = \vec{AP}$$

$$\therefore \vec{OP} = \vec{OA} + \vec{AP}$$

$$= \begin{bmatrix} 3 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix} + \frac{4}{5} \begin{bmatrix} -3 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$= \begin{bmatrix} \frac{3}{5} \\ \frac{9}{5} \end{bmatrix}$$

$$(c) (i) \quad \cos 3\theta = \cos 2\theta \cos \theta - \sin 2\theta \sin \theta$$

$$= (2\cos^2\theta - 1)\cos\theta - 2\sin\theta\cos\theta\sin\theta$$

$$= 2\cos^3\theta - \cos\theta - 2\cos\theta(1 - \cos^2\theta)$$

$$= 2\cos^3\theta - \cos\theta - 2\cos\theta + 2\cos^3\theta$$

$$= 4\cos^3\theta - 3\cos\theta \quad \text{as required.}$$

$$(ii) \quad 8x^3 - 6x - 1 = 0$$

$$\therefore 4x^3 - 3x = \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\text{Let } x = \cos\theta \quad \therefore 4\cos^3\theta - 3\cos\theta = \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\therefore U \sin 60^\circ - 10t = 0$$

$$U \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} = 10t$$

$$t = \frac{U\sqrt{3}}{20} \quad \text{as required}$$

(ii) Projectile B : $\frac{V}{\sqrt{2}} - 10t = 0$

$$V = 10\sqrt{2}t$$

$$\begin{aligned} \left(\text{Flight times must be equal} \right) &= 10\sqrt{2} \cdot \frac{U\sqrt{3}}{20} \\ &= \frac{U\sqrt{6}}{2} \quad \text{as required} \end{aligned}$$

The x -coordinates must be the same, so equating these

$$\therefore d - \frac{U^2\sqrt{6}\sqrt{3}}{40\sqrt{2}} = \frac{U^2\sqrt{3}}{40}$$

$$\begin{aligned} d &= \frac{U^2\sqrt{3}}{40} + \frac{U^2\sqrt{3}}{40} \\ &= \frac{U^2\sqrt{3}(1+\sqrt{3})}{40} \end{aligned}$$
